New Neighbor Gift

If your church members work in the business community, ask them to donate items for the bags.

Here are a few ideas for the swag bag:

- Edit and print a hard copy of the communication templates on unique paper.
- A product(s) or gift(s) from local vendors – e.g., a small bag of coffee from a coffee shop, coupons/gift card to nearby favorite stores or restaurants, art from an artist.
- A swag item from your church (shirt, carabiner, magnet, etc.).
- A swag item from the local schools in town.
- Flyer or handout about the upcoming events at church.
- A local magazine from the Chamber of Commerce with the latest news.
- Add a staff member's business card.

Gift Idea

New Member Gift

This gift is similar to the “New Neighbor Gift.” Gather together a few items and place them in a bag, basket, etc. Then keep them readily available so church members can pick them up and distribute them to the new members. Some churches host a meal, so you could offer this gift at that time. If your church members work in the business community, ask them to donate items for the bags.

Here are a few ideas for the swag bag:

- A product(s) or gift(s) from local vendors – e.g., a small bag of coffee from a coffee shop, coupons/gift card to nearby favorite stores or restaurants, art from an artist.
- A few swag items from your church (shirt, carabiner, magnet, etc.).
- If possible, add a personal touch with a few swag items from their elementary school.
- Flyer or handout about the upcoming events at church. Tie a few extras with a ribbon, twine, etc., and include a little note that reads, “For your friends.”
- Handout including staff contacts, list of church ministries that help within the community, ways to get involved, etc.

Helpful Tips

Here are a few questions to help spur on the creative process. They are starting points for any brainstorming session among staff, volunteers, etc. Try putting yourself in the shoes of the families who visit your church (and children’s area, if applicable).

- Can guests quickly identify who we are as a church? This includes clear descriptions of the nature and structure of our congregation. Many churches have this posted on a page of the website for people to read prior to their first visit, but be sure this is also communicated to people as they connect with you in person.
- How will guests know they are truly welcome at our church? Once they arrive, do we have a system to follow up with them? From first impressions (on campus) to follow-up communications (via text/call/email/in-person visit), make sure the team works in harmony to help ensure guests can get further connected to the church.
- How do we point to what’s next? What is the next step we desire guests to take in our church? Is it joining a small group? Attending a welcome event or guest orientation? Become a member of the church? This answer points people to the church’s purpose and vision. When both are explained clearly and consistently, the church helps guests identify their next steps and what role they can play in fulfilling the mission of your church.
- Is it clear what we believe? Where can we provide a quick list to our church’s core beliefs, including doctrine, mission, purpose, etc.?

- Gain an understanding of the gospel
- Learn keywords and phrases related to the gospel, Christianity, and the church
- Answer any questions your child has about becoming a Christian
- Decorate a ‘memory box’ that each child takes home after the class. For ideas on what to include in the box, see the Gift Idea section.

Gift Idea

When a student chooses to join the family of faith, make it a big deal! Celebrate with a goodie bag of some type, such as “Party-In-A-Box.”

Your bag, basket or box can include:

- A devotional to get them started
- A journal
- A fun and creative pen/pencil
- Candy or fun snacks
- A handout/flyer of other students' stories on how Jesus has helped them in their journey (possibly include drawings)
- A handout/flyer of upcoming events

Helpful Tips

Here are a few questions to help spur on the creative process. They are starting points for any brainstorming session among staff, volunteers, etc.

- How can we help them grow in their walk with Christ? Consider the context of how/when they made their commitment to trust Christ. Was it at an event? Was the family a first-time guest or a long-time visitor? Do we have parents' support? Individual context can help you provide a good idea of where to start.
- Do we have a mentor/discipleship program? Is there a leader/ volunteer who can pair with them to help mentor?
- How can we help them learn about their spiritual gifts? Once they become a follower of Christ, God gives them spiritual gifts to help encourage the body. How can the church help them learn about those gifts and use them?
